**Peter Turnley** is renowned for his photography of the realities of the human condition. His photographs have been featured on the cover of Newsweek 43 times and are published frequently in many of the world's most prestigious publications. He has worked in over 90 countries and has witnessed most major stories of international geopolitical and historic significance in the last 40 years.

Turnley's photographs have been featured in Paris Match, Newsweek, Time, New York Times, Stern, Harper's Magazine, Le Monde, Le Figaro, and most of the world's most prestigious publications.

Turnley has photographed most of the world's conflicts, including Northern Ireland, the Gulf War of 1991, the Balkans (Bosnia), Somalia, Rwanda, Chechnya, the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, Afghanistan, and the 2003 war in Iraq. He has produced portraits and covered many of the modern world's most influential leaders, including Barack Obama, Fidel Castro, Mikhail Gorbachev, Nelson Mandela, Vladimir Putin and Pope John Paul II.

Among the many international awards Turnley has won are the Overseas Press Club Award for Best Photographic Reporting from Abroad, numerous awards and citations from World Press Photo, and the University of Missouri's Pictures of the Year competition.
